Questions and answers regarding the Latin American and Spanish Theme

Question #1

What music can we use?

The Theme is Latin American and Spanish music, which includes 1) music by composers who were born in those areas, or who spent most of their lives there, and 2) music in Latin American or Spanish style by composers of any nationality.

For example, anything by Ginastera, Seixas, or Mompou will work, and any of Debussy's Spanish-style music, such as La puerta del vino and La sérénade interrompue, will work. From our pedagogical composers, Spanish Rhapsody by Melody Bober and Flamenco by William Gillock leap to mind, and there are many, many more. Also, compositions in Latin jazz style, and dances such as tangos, rumbas, boleros, etc. This is a wonderfully varied Theme open to many composers, many styles, and all the piano music eras.

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2013 Convention Theme Latin American and Spanish Music

Question #2

What about sarabandes?

Generally, sarabandes will probably not fit the Latin American and Spanish theme, unless written by a composer from those areas. Most sarabandes, i.e. those from Bach suites, are quite different in style from their lively Latin American and Spanish ancestors. (Grove's)

Question #3

What about Domenico Scarlatti?

I think teachers can ask themselves several questions about a Scarlatti piece: "Does this Sonata sound of Spanish influence?" and "Am I teaching my student about Latin American and Spanish music with this piece?" and "Does this piece fit the spirit of the Theme?" and "Will evaluators understand this as a Spanish piece?" If the answers are yes for a particular piece, then use it. If not, remember Scarlatti Sonatas are syllabus pieces, so they qualify at their levels for Festival recitals.
