Please note that the Contemporary Festival is scheduled for January 10, 2016 - Valley College Recital Hall.

Our first event of the season is the General Recital "Beginners and Pops," October 18th at Valley College. Chairperson,

Michael Paul, will be contacting those of you who have registered students participating in this event. Once the exact timing of the recitals is set, I will notify all of you so that you might attend even if you do not have students participating. Some teachers who have not participated in General Recitals before may wish to attend to observe.

The second event of the 2015/16 season is the Mark Richman Master Class, November 1st, 4 to 6 PM, at Pasadena Steinway. Mark is a master teacher who excels at the master class format. Please contact Mark if you have students you want to register for this class. Many teachers from our branch attend this class even if we do not have students participating in the class. Mark is an outstanding teacher.

Li Ming-Qiang will be leading a master class November 15th, 2 to 5 PM, at his daughter's house in Pasadena. His daughter, Jing Li, is also a member of MTAC. Professor Li lives in Hong Kong, but will be in the United States for a brief visit. Several of us in the Branch know him to be an exceptional person, pianist, and teacher! Despite his rare credentials (including being a juror for the Van Cliburn Competition), Professor Li is a very down-to-earth person who is happy to teach all who want to learn. Please let me know if you are interested in performing in or auditing this class. Trust me - you will not be sorry if you spend some time in his company!! https://youtu.be/gq5u10shCQY - samples of his recordings Biographical information below:

(Ming-Qiang Li is a <u>Chinese</u> classical <u>pianist</u>. He studied under <u>Alfred Wittenberg</u> and Tatiana Kravchenko, and as a young pianist in the late 1950s and early 1960s won awards at several Eastern European music competitions: the <u>Smetana</u> Competition in Prague in 1957 (3rd prize), the <u>George Enescu International Piano Competition</u> in Bucharest in 1958 (1st prize), the <u>International Frederick Chopin Piano Competition</u> (sic) in Warsaw in 1960 (4th prize). His recordings comprise pieces by the classics and romantics, as well as piano music by Chinese composers. During the <u>Chinese Cultural Revolution</u> (1966–1976) Li Ming-Qiang was sent to a work farm, subjected to torture [1]. Unfortunately, the Cultural Revolution marked the end of his career as a concert pianist, although studio recordings of his performances were made as late as 1982 [2]. In 1984 Li Ming-Qiang became Vice President of the Shanghai Conservatory of Music (1984–1989), a professor of piano, and Chairman of the Shanghai Piano Association. He served as a juror at many international piano competitions, among others those of Van Cliburn in Fort Worth, Enescu in Bucharest, Chopin in Warsaw, as well as in Sydney, Shanghai, Paris, Montreal, and Santander. In 1989 he relocated temporarily to the USA, where he held master classes at several music centers. In 1997 he moved to Hong Kong and became a professor in the Music and Arts Department at the <u>Baptist University in Hong Kong</u>. Despite his relatively short performing-career, Li Ming-Qiang is ranked among the influential contemporary classical pianists (recorded).)

Dear Branch Members who are entering students in Certificate of Merit:

Each year, there is some confusion about qualifications for Branch Honors. Since this is registration month for CM, I thought it might be helpful for you to see the qualifications (listed below) before you register students. Teachers MUST click on the Branch Honors Box in order for your student to be selected. No student can be selected for this honor if the box on the registration form was not clicked even if their performance at CM is exceptional!!

Students must:

- be Level IV or above
- pass theory with 70% or better
- receive a 5- or better rating for the piece chosen
- receive "Average" or better rating for sight-reading
- receive "Good" or better rating for technique

piece selected must be memorized, but not all the pieces have to be memorized (memory requirement for Level IV and above is two pieces of the three or four performed plus the etude for Level 10)

Music Competition for San Fernando Valley High School Students

My name is Betsy, I'm a member of the West San Fernando Valley MTAC branch. I wanted to reach out and let you know that the organization where I teach piano has partnered with the Valley Cultural Center to offer a music competition and scholarship opportunity for high school students. See details below.

Valley Talent Music Scholarship Program Details:

Application Process:

- Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:
- o Be 14 to 18 years old and current high school students

- o Live in the San Fernando Valley (proof or residence will be requested)
- Applicants must choose from one of the two categories below:
- Non-Classical Performance (Pop, Rock, Jazz, etc.)
- o Classical Performance

Participants may play any instrument that fits under the categories of woodwind, brass, strings, and percussion. (No computerbased musical instruments allowed)

*Bands and ensembles may participate, but the award amount will remain fixed.

• Applicants must submit application forms along with video submissions and any other attachments by November 30, 2015.

Selection Process:

• Preliminary Auditions

Based on the video submissions, our judges will choose the number of applicants that will advance to the live auditions. All applicants chosen to go forward to the live auditions will be provided personal and detailed feedback on their video submission and invited to attend a master class focused on developing presentation and performance skills.

Live Auditions

The date of the live auditions will be announced shortly after receipt of submissions. All students will get a maximum of 15 minutes to perform in front of three Judges. The judges will choose one finalist and two semifinalists for each of the two categories.

Awards:

Finalists in each category will receive a cash scholarship of \$1,000 Semifinalists will receive a cash scholarship of \$500 (2 semifinalists per category)




