The exact position a candidate may hold within the State Board of Directors is determined by a separate set of guidelines and will be dealt with directly by the Nominating Committee. #### **Certificate of Merit**

#### **Important Changes for the 2012 CM Piano Syllabus**

Dear Branch Chairs and Teachers,

CM Council is happy to announce the following changes for the 2012 Piano Syllabus.. Our committees have worked very hard to consider your requests for clarity and expand the repertoire.

The Syllabus is about to be printed, so no specific questions will be answered. In the order of "fairness" our release of information must be consistent for everyone, so please do not expect us to answer specific questions.

CM Council will present the new syllabus to you at Convention on Friday morning. The State Office will be selling the syllabus and notify you of the Convention discount.

Two major changes to be aware of.

Ear Training: Prep Level will have Ear Training

**Repertoire:** Four categories instead of five:

- 1. Baroque: Pieces written approximately between 1600 and 1750
- 2. Classical: Pieces written approximately between 1750 and 1825
- 3. Romantic and Impressionistic: Pieces written approximately between 1825 and 1900
- 4. 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Century: Pieces by composers who have "come of age" in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century (Composers born approximately 1880 or after)

#### **Composers Today**

The evaluations are now finished and available on the individual teacher's pages on the website. Login and click on Composers Today and then Evaluations to see them. There are links there to print them out for your students.

If your student received an average score of 4 or 5, she or he is eligible to enter the Symposium. The application for the Symposium can be found on the Evaluations page. Your student will need to submit a recording of his or her performance of the piece by April 15 to enter the Symposium. More information is available on the website.

Compositions for the State Contest are due to your Branch Chair by March 30. This is an "in the hands" due date, not a postmark date. For more information about the State Contest, go to the MTAC website, Login, click on Composers Today and then Documents. The instructions and application forms are there in PDF form.

Don't forget that San Diego Branch is having a special composition contest in honor of their 100 years of existence. This contest is open to students 21 or younger. They must be a student of an MTAC teacher. The work should be 5-7 minutes long and reflect something about San Diego. #### **Improvisation**

#### **Improvisation Evaluation Deadline -- postmark by March 15!**

This is the 7th year of the annual Improvisation Evaluation. The Evaluation Information and Application Forms for 2012 are posted on the MTAC website. Choose the Standard Evaluation (one improvisation) or the Advanced Evaluation (two improvisations for more advanced students). Fill in the forms and mail them with the fee to Alexandra Hawley, Improvisation Council Chair. You may mail a CD recording of your student's improvisation, or email the improvisation as an mp3.

Students may apply for "Evaluation Only" and will receive written comments and a rating. Or students may apply for "Evaluation and Convention Performance". Those with high ratings will be considered for Convention Improvisation Recitals which include the Improvisation Celebration Recital, and the Improvisation Honors Recital for the advanced improvisers (previously called the Improvisation Showcase Recital).

Branch Chairs and all interested teachers are encouraged to attend the Teacher Improvisation Workshop at the Convention to learn ways to teach improvisation to your students. The Improvisation Information Meeting will be included in the workshop.

#### The postmark deadline for Improvisation Evaluation is March 15, 2012.

#### **2012 Convention Registration**

Early-bird convention registration is available to members up until May 15 and is only \$170.

Pre registration pricing is available until June 15 and is \$210. After Jun 15 the registration fee will be the full price of \$250. We also offer reduced prices on the registration form for a non member spouse/relative, or college student.

All teachers attending the convention for any reason are required to register and will be mailed a registration invoice if they do attend and fail to register.

Single day registrations are available for \$80 until May 15. Single day pricing is\$100 between May 16 and June 15. After June 15 the single day registration is \$120.

You may register for the convention through Cvent, online registration. An invitation will be sent to you from Cvent around March 20, or you may visit the MTAC website. You will also find the registration form in the Winter 2012 *California Music Teacher* Magazine.

It's not too soon to start planning for your stay at the beautiful Town and Country Hotel in San Diego. The MTAC was able to renegotiate the room rate here down to \$119 per night for the Garden Style Bungalows or \$129 per night for the Royal Palm Tower and Regency Tower.

To obtain the necessary amount of meeting, recital and exhibit space at the hotel, MTAC must commit to a minimum number of guest rooms at the official hotel. If that commitment is not met, MTAC would incur significant financial penalties and have difficulty obtaining sufficient meeting space in the future.

There are many alternate hotels in this area. Please help the Association avoid penalties by booking your reservation at the Town and Country Hotel. The rooms are very nice, the grounds are exquisite, and it is fun to socialize with colleagues after hours.
