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Certificate of Merit, Path B

In the March issue of the MTAC News, I spoke to you regarding our intellectual property and the need to protect our State Programs. The State Board appointed a special committee to gather information and advisement from State Chairs, Certificate of Merit Council, MTAC State Office personnel, and outside experts regarding the best ways to protect our State Programs.

Based on the committee's findings, the MTAC State Board of Directors has decided to eliminate Path B of the Certificate of Merit program. This was a difficult decision. It affects all who participate in the program.

The 2012 Theory Tests will not be sold at Convention but will be available for purchase by members through the MTAC website.

More information will be provided at the Certificate of Merit meetings at the MTAC Annual Convention. We look forward to seeing you all in San Diego soon.

Parent/Adult Student Consent Form and Waiver

Beginning in the 2012-2013 fiscal year, MTAC will require all parents to sign an online consent form and liability waiver for children. Adult students, 18 years and over, will need to sign the forms themselves. The form will be similar to those signed by parents when their children participate in youth sports, school music programs, and other extracurricular activities. This will involve some changes for teachers in the online registration process for State Programs next year. Training sessions will be provided for you or your designated Branch representative at the MTAC Convention to help facilitate this process.

Improvisation Sessions will be held on Sunday, July 1.

Students submitted their recorded improvisations and received written evaluations and ratings from 1 to 5. Students with ratings of 4+ and above were selected to play in two **Improvisation Celebration Recitals** at this year's Convention. These students will perform their prepared improvisations, and will also play "improvisation games" during the Celebration Recital.

Advanced students had the opportunity to have two improvisations evaluated. Each student chose an improvisation topic from the 2012 Advanced Improvisation Application as the basis of their second improvisation. Five advanced students with ratings of 5 and 5+ will perform in the **Improvisation Honors Recital**. In addition to the improvisations submitted, these students will improvise on topics and ideas announced "on-the-spot" in the Improvisation Honors Recital. You will hear some very talented young musicians. This is a session you don't want to miss!

Day 1 of the Concerto-Solo Southern Regionals was held at El Camino College on Saturday, April 28. 123 students competed. Due to a 40% increase in applications this year it was necessary to add a second day for the first time in Concerto-Solo history!

Day 2 of the Regionals took place at the new Steinway Piano Gallery in Pasadena, and was dedicated to the Solo III high school division. 35 students participated for a grand total of 158 students in the competition this year.

A little over 25% of the field placed, including a winner in each division, along with 1st and 2nd Alternates, and Honorable Mentions. The four Solo winners in the South will now prepare to play against the four Solo winners in the North, with the same preparations taking place for the eight Concerto winners in their respective categories.

The playing level in every age division continues to be very high, and given the competitive nature, generates a lot of excitement in the audience. Please make every effort to attend one or both of the final rounds!

VOCE Winners Recital on Sunday, July 1, 7:30 p.m. in the Regency Ballroom

From the moment I met the Northern California students at the airport, I could feel the excitement and anticipation which would become even more palpable once I entered the halls on the beautiful campus of Chapman University at the VOCE Competition State Finals. Students from all around California were arriving in their gowns (and even tails) from the ages of 9-23! *Winds*, *Strings*, *Pianists*, *Singers* as well as several *Chamber Ensembles* whispering excitedly to each other as they registered. The sounds of many virtuosic performances were wafting in the background as students warmed up or were performing for the judges.

One of the most inspiring things about the VOCE Competition is that it brings together all these incredibly gifted young musicians and we get to see how professional they are at such a young age. It is also moving to know how many of them will go on to major careers in music. In fact, it was only fitting this year that the VOCE Finals took place in the same month when Kenneth Renshaw (a VOCE winner just a couple of years ago) won the highly prestigious Menuhin International Competition in Beijing (now at the ripe old age of 18). It's no coincidence that his teacher, Li Lin, from the Palo Alto Branch has been sending students to VOCE for many years and whose students often won 1st place in the competitions (including this year's competition). More and more teachers from all over California have discovered what an incredible forum VOCE creates to inspire and motivate the serious young musicians of tomorrow.

However, while the standard of the soloists' level is truly staggering, as an avid and dedicated chamber musician myself, I always look forward to hearing the fantastic panoply of chamber ensembles. This year my favorites included several piano quartets and piano trios. To me, seeing not only such a high level of individual musicianship but also the level of teamwork, camaraderie, interdependence and dedication of these young chamber musicians is the most inspiring component of VOCE.

I have to say that it also has been a pleasure to work with Jane Masur who did such an incredible amount of work to make everything run smoothly (including cooking the most amazing spread of snacks and lunch for all of us!). With VOCE now fully online, there have been many twists and turns as we all come to understand this wonderful new system. However, nothing affected the wonderful atmosphere of the VOCE Finals and I give full credit to Jane Masur and Lowell Webster, MTAC Webmaster, for their assistance! Additionally, we had some wonderful guidance and support from former VOCE Chair, Verna Balch, the patient and good-humored energy of Shirley Yamamoto, and Lisa Honea for monitoring rooms all day and equally importantly, Verna's son, Peter, and Jane's husband, Dennis, driving the airport shuttles all day which was crucial to the success of the day (it certainly does take a village!)

You will be able to hear these amazing "whiz kids" strut their stuff for yourself at the VOCE Winners Recital on Sunday, July 1, 7:30 p.m. in the Regency Ballroom. The 2012 MTAC Convention in San Diego (Friday, June 29 through Tuesday, July 3) at Town and Country Resort & Convention Center, 500 Hotel Circle North, San Diego, needs over **200** (yes, two hundred!) responsible high school (or mature junior high) students to be pages during the convention. Each page may serve at least one 4 hour shift and may invite a friend (who need not be a music student) to page with them. Teachers and parents are also encouraged to be pages. Please help! We will need all the pages we can get. This is an excellent opportunity for your students to be an essential part of all the wonderful events at the convention. One incentive for your students to become a page would be the possibility of receiving (upon request) a letter of recommendation, which could be added to any college scholarship or job application.
